 - b. Read Zechariah 9:9. Why was it significant for Jesus to ride into Jerusalem on a colt? (See Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 559 [CCC 559])

 - a. Why was Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem important? (See CCC 560)
 - b. How do we commemorate this event in the Church today?
3. What irony is implied by the manner in which Jesus entered Jerusalem? (See CCC 559)

DAYS 2 & 3 – LUKE 19:35-40

4. How did the triumphal entry in the Gospels fulfill what you see in Psalm 118:19-29? (See also Mk 11:8)
5. Where in the Mass do you hear the phrase "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord"?
6. The disciples acclaimed Jesus as King. What do you learn from Psalm 93 and Daniel 7:13-14 about the Kingship of Christ?
7. Why would the Pharisees want Jesus to rebuke His disciples?
8. What did Jesus mean when He said, "I tell you, if they keep silent, the stones will cry out"?

DAY 4 – LUKE 19:41-44

 - a. Why do you think Jesus wept over Jerusalem?
 - b. If Jesus came riding into your city today, about what might He weep?
10. The Jews did not recognize Jesus' visitation. In what ways have you recognized Christ in your life this week? **(Personal)**

DAY 5 – LUKE 19:45-48

 - a. What details do you pick up from the other Gospels about the cleansing of the temple? (See Mt 21:12-13; Mk 11:15-17; Jn 2:13-17)
 - b. What human emotion did Jesus demonstrate in this incident?
